Who Are We?

Great Basin Basket CSA is a partnership of Nevada farmers, Jim & Tina Smith and Rick & B. Ann Lattin, and Pauline Hamilton, managing partner in the company. The mission of the company is to provide northern Nevada families with high quality seasonal produce grown on local sustainable farms. In 2009, we will be offering a variety of products produced right here in Northern Nevada for special order!

What's in a Basket?

When you join, you will receive a variety of seasonal produce in every weekly basket. Our 32 week season options and list of produce are outlined herein. Content and volume of the basket varies from week to week. Generally, the season starts off with lots of cool-season vegetables, such as carrots, herbs and salad greens. During the hot summer months, you will find corn, tomatoes and melons in your basket. The season will end with winter squash, potatoes, greens and pumpkins. Again this year we will offer in-season local bouquets for purchase. You will find a world of recipe options as you explore the contents of the basket and read farmer Tina's weekly online newsletter.



How Do I Join?

The CSA philosophy makes you a partner in the farming process. Your pre-paid subscription ensures farmers have money to buy seeds, prepare the ground and grow your crops--and you are rewarded by the bountiful harvest! You must register to participate before the start of each season because we plant for each family. Spaces may be available after the season has begun, but the subscription price will be higher. You can pay the basket subscription amount in full or in three payments (see registration form for details). You can find the registration form online at our website www.greatbasinbasket.com.

To assure your participation in this program, we ask you to fill out the registration form and send a check with your selected form of payment. Your commitment helps farmers decide how much to plant. Once we plant for you, we count on you!

Where do I pick up my Basket?

The Baskets will be dropped off at locations near you varying by season, so please check the registration form (Reno, Carson City, Gardnerville, and Fallon/Fernley). If you organize over 20 subscriptions for one location, you may be considered for a designated drop-off site. Details will follow once you subscribe.



Light Green Spring

10 weeks from April 28th thru June 30th
\$280.00 (\$28/wk)

This season brings lettuces of all kinds, spinach, mesclun mix, baby greens, kale, baby chard, stir fry green mix, vit green, tatsoi, broccoli raab, arugula, basil, oregano, dill, and cilantro. Late June also brings peas, beets, carrots, daikon radishes, and asparagus.

Full Summer

14 weeks from July 14th thru October 15th
\$450.00 (\$32.15/wk)

July begins with a bit of baby greens, kale, baby chard, arugula, green onion, garlic, peas, beets, carrots daikon radish, new potatoes. Then the cucumbers kick in along with eggplant, green beans, melon, tomatoes, sweet corn, zucchini, summer squash. August and September will offer more cucumbers, eggplant, green beans, melon and watermelon, raspberries, tomatoes, peppers of many kinds, and cabbage, cipicolini and keeper onions, leeks, garlic, carrots, beets and turnips. As soon as it gets cold we'll have winter squash and all pumpkin varieties, plus the cold greens start to come again.

Optional Items at Additional Cost:

Weekly Buckaroo Bouquet: \$125.00 for 10 weeks of local flowers July 14th to mid September from Smith & Smith Farms in Dayton.

Fruit Share: \$280 for 14 weeks from July 14th to early October.

Thanksgiving Special: Nov. 24th: \$200 for 8 people to enjoy--everything but the turkey!

Bountiful harvest items will be made available in bulk amounts for canning & freezing.

Payment Options: *(Other payment options available.)*

Early Payment Discounts: Pay for all 3 seasons by March 31st and pay \$900.00--a \$130.00 discount for the season. Discount only available on 3 season subscriptions.

Payment Plan: 3 month payment plan of \$300 per month if you commit and pay your first \$300 by March 31st. After March 31st, 1 payment of \$344 & 2 of \$343 will apply.

Pay Per Season: You may pay 2 weeks in advance before the start of each season. A \$50.00 late fee is applied to payments not received at least 2 weeks prior to start of season.
